TWENTY-EIGHTH SUNDAY OF THE YEAR. Theme: Divine Invitation to the Wedding Banquet

"If Christ did not want to dismiss the Jews without food in the desert for fear that they would collapse on the way, it was to teach us that it is dangerous to try to get to heaven without the Bread of Heaven." - St. Jerome
The invitation to a wedding banquet is one of the favourites images used to describe the joy of God's Kingdom established by Jesus Christ. The marital relationship between human beings and God has a transcendent dimension since its full realization is in the life of the world to come. It is puzzling to note that the king in the Gospel cast out a guest for not being properly dressed for the occasion when the guests are "anyone you come upon" on the byroads. Maybe the poor fellow came from the field where he had been working all the day. The answer is that the passage consists of two parables that have fused together by Matthew.

The moral lesson of the parable is our preparedness to accept God's invitation to the wedding banquet. The Eucharist is an anticipation of the heavenly banquet. The wedding garments represent our good deeds that will permit us to participate worthily in the Messianic Banquet. If we are not well prepared through our good deeds we will not be accepted into the Wedding Banquet – unfortunately, we will be thrown out.

Our Prayer today is "Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed."
