**TWENTIETH SUNDAY OF THE YEAR.** Theme: Woman, you have great Faith...

Just the previous Sunday (19th Sunday in Ordinary Time) Jesus was saddened by the little faith of his own disciples. Today, he is struck with admiration at the great faith of the Canaanite woman. Does the Faith of some parishioners sometimes surprise you during the liturgical gathering? Sometimes we tend to think of God as our own exclusive property. But He is the God of the entire world, of both Christians and non-Christians.

The healing of the Canaanite woman's daughter suggests Christ's openness in love and respect for people of other faiths. He rewards the spirit of persistent faith. When the woman heard that Jesus had come to her town, her heart must have leapt in anticipation. As she approached him – presumably with a mixture of desperation and hope – she cried out: "Sir, Son of David, Have mercy on me, O Lord; my daughter is seriously possessed by a demon" (Matt.15: 22). When Jesus told her that He had been sent "only to the lost sheep of the house of Israel (Matt. 15:24), she pressed on in faith: "Lord, help me... even the dogs eat the crumbs that fall from their master's table" (15:25, 27).

Jesus rewarded her persistent faith. Thus, an outsider (Gentile woman) received the blessings of Yahweh while those from within (Jewish people) looked on! God's power and promises are not limited to his chosen people. They are available to all who follow their own good conscience, care for justice and act with integrity.

May our prayer today lead us to the warmth divine love of Christ, which surpasses every human desire.

**Feast of St Gregory.** The Feast of St Gregory falls every year on 3<sup>rd</sup> September, which this year falls on a Sunday. This day is also the day on which the church was consecrated in 2004. The celebration of the anniversary of the consecration of the church is celebrated on the Sunday, and we will be celebrating the feast of St Gregory on the Friday evening, 1<sup>st</sup> September, with Mass at 7pm and usual reception afterwards. This year they are also celebrating the 70<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the establishing of the parish, and Bishop Peter will be celebrating the Mass, together with the priests of the Pastoral Area. Everyone is welcome to join them.
