

From the desk of Fr Jerry. FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT

"Man with all his shrewdness is as stupid about understanding by himself the mysteries of God, as an ass is incapable of understanding musical harmony." - John Calvin

As we journey through this life, we are often assailed with fears, doubts and dilemmas. These are some of the causes of our spiritual blindness. Jesus Christ, our Shepherd-King cures our blindness and lights up the way for us.

The cure of the blind man offers us insights into the need for us to be cured of our spiritual blindness in order to make fresh commitments to Jesus Christ. Jesus did not agree with his disciples that it was somebody's sin, which caused the man's physical blindness. His answer was: "he was blind so that the works of God might be displayed in him". God permitted the man to be born blind.

The Pharisees were upset that Jesus had cured on the Sabbath. For them, Jesus was a sinner. Others did not agree: "how could a sinner produce signs like this?" While the Pharisees were hard at it to discredit Jesus as the Messiah, the man born blind saw him as a prophet, a man of God or someone from God: "if this man were not from God, he could not do a thing". At the end of the story, we realise that it was the Pharisees who were seriously blind. This was because they refused to believe in Jesus Christ.

Let us come to Jesus Christ to heal us of all forms of blindness

May our spiritual blindness cause by the challenges of the world give way to bright light of the gospel of Christ.
