17TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME. Theme: Our Choice for the Kingdom...

"It's your obligation to speak the truth, and everyone can either take it or leave it.

But truth must be in us. We live in such a poverty of truth today."-Mother Angelica

The two parables underscore the priceless value of the Kingdom of God for which no sacrifice is too great. Are we prepared to sacrifice everything or even offer any ultimate sacrifice of our life in order to attain whatever we treasure in life? The two parables of the treasure and the pearl, suggest that the Kingdom of God (reign of God) is the supreme value of life, so important that no sacrifice is too small for it.

The ultimate value of the Kingdom of God or God's Kingly rule is a question of priority of values. In a society, which is ever more doing away with values that used to be sacred to the Christian life such as the value of life, sound judgment, respect for authority etc. we need a priceless treasure like the TRUTH. The Truth is the greatest treasure that can be known through the Holy Spirit. Our entire spiritual life consists of searching for the TRUTH and the JOY of finding. Those who respond to Christ's invitation to the Kingdom of heaven will find the TRUTH, while those who do not do so will remain puzzled by the parables he preached.

May the Holy Spirit touch our hearts and lead us to a deeper understanding of the truth about the kingdom of God.

Our Holy Mother Church calls us to come to Jesus Christ, the Son of God. Feast of St Gregory: The Feast of St Gregory falls every year on 3rd September, which this year falls on a Sunday. This day is also the day on which the church was consecrated in 2004. The celebration of the anniversary of the consecration of the church is celebrated on the Sunday, and we will be celebrating the feast of St Gregory on the Friday evening, 1st September, with Mass at 7pm and usual reception afterwards. This year they are also celebrating the 70th anniversary of the establishing of the parish, and Bishop Peter will be celebrating the Mass, together with the priests of the Pastoral Area. Everyone is welcome to join them.

Eucharistic Adoration at Sacred Heart: Following recent thefts, and as a number of their regular 'watchers' are on holiday during the next few weeks and they do not want to have just one person on their own, they have regretfully decided to reduce the hours for adoration until September. **Adoration will only be on Mondays from 10.00 - 12.00 and not on Saturdays.** They will review the situation for September.
