From the desk of Fr Jerry. PASSION SUNDAY/PALM SUNDAY

"We are not as Christ-centred and cross-cherishing as we should be, because we do not ponder the truth that everything good, and everything bad that God turns for the good, was purchased by the sufferings of Christ." — John Piper.

Passion Sunday or Palm Sunday begins the Holy Week celebrations, the most important week in the liturgical calendar. During this week, we recall the stages of Christ's passing from this world. It is a solemn passage through betrayal, denial, injustice and brutal suffering; a movement from death to resurrection taken together as one great event which brought salvation to the whole world. All the four evangelists relate the narrative of Christ's passion with little differences. Matthew, like Mark, stresses that Jesus died to save the world. Jesus accomplishes his task with total obedience and humility to his Father. He focuses on his goal, the cross and the resurrection. Even as he enters Jerusalem like a King, he does not look at the excited crowd. He sees beyond all the noise and movements to what is ahead of him – crucifixion, death and resurrection. Let us accompany Jesus in his triumphant entry into Jerusalem, not as spectators but actors in the drama of the passion. Let see ourselves as hailing Jesus: "Hosanna to the Son of David" and equally crying out: "Crucify him". We are either Judas who betrayed him or Peter who denied him or one of the soldiers who mocked him depending on how life has treated us.

May Christ, the Saviour of the World Save us by His Cross and Resurrection.
