SECOND SUNDAY OF EASTER or DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY

Theme: I believe in the Forgiveness of Sins (CCC.976)

Jesus Christ repeatedly revealed himself to his disciples after his resurrection to drive home the fact that he was alive. Since he was no longer constrained by space and time, he was able to stand among his disciples although they had closed the doors of the house in which they stayed. He gave them the promised gift of peace, the kind of peace that the world cannot give. This peace simply means total well-being or wholeness. Surely, it is only Jesus Christ who gives total well-being.

Christ commissioned his disciples and gave them the Holy Spirit to forgive sins. Forgiveness of Sins is linked with the Holy Spirit. The Sacrament of Reconciliation has its roots in this text as well the authority of Pope, the successor of Peter, to bind and loose (c.f Matt. 16:19; 18:8). One potent way of experiencing the fountain of Christ's mercy is through the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Through this sacrament, Christ restores us to friendship and to a life of grace. Forgiveness is linked with Peace.

We should not doubt the efficacy of this sacrament like Thomas wanting to put his finger into the holes of Christ's side. We should rather approach this sacrament with awe, humility and a contrite heart as Thomas exclaimed, "My Lord and my God!"

The gospel accounts have been recorded so that we may come to believe in Jesus Christ. We must strive daily to grow in faith. "Jesus, we trust in thee!"
