

TRINITY SUNDAY. Theme: All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me.

As the authority of Jesus provides a basis for the commission of the disciples, so the mystery of the Most Holy Trinity is the source of all the other mysteries of faith, the light that enlightens them (CCC#234). It is true that a person discloses himself in his actions, and the better we know a person, the better we understand his actions.

God the Father wills that Jesus' existent authority be exercised universally. Having refused the devil's offer of authority over all kingdoms of the world (Matt. 4:8-10), Jesus now receives authority from the Father.

Jesus Christ commissions his disciples to make disciples of all the nations and to baptize them in the name of the Trinity.

This is to affirm how the whole history of salvation is identical with the history of the way and the means by which the one true God, the Son and Holy Spirit, reveals himself to men and reconciles and unites with those who turn away from sin.

At the heart of Jesus' commission is the command to make disciples by baptism and teaching. Discipleship entails both becoming a Christian (being baptized) and being a Christian (obeying Jesus' teaching).

God the Holy Spirit himself and our spirit bear united witness that we are children of God. Baptism in the Holy Spirit underscores the initiation of Christians into the life of the Holy Trinity, a life of ceaseless love, unity and mutual cooperation. In the Most Holy Trinity, we discover how by the divine mission of the Son and the Holy Spirit, God the Father fulfils the plan of loving goodness' of creation, redemption and sanctification. (CCC#235)

May the Blessed Trinity strengthen and inspire us to live as true Christians.

CAFOD - Share the Journey Pope Francis has launched Share the Journey, a new global campaign to stand up for the rights of people on the move. CAFOD asks us to join together in walking around the world. On 10 June we will walk in solidarity with our global neighbours fleeing their homes. We will be walking around the reservoir at Sywell Country Park – a distance of only 2.5 miles. The miles we walk will be added to the total from across England and Wales. Please join us for a Sunday afternoon walk. The circular walk is fairly easy but not suitable for wheelchairs. If you are bringing a child's buggy and find the terrain tricky you may prefer to walk a shorter distance and turn back at the point where the footpath ends. Register and begin the walk in the lower car park between 1.30pm and 2.30pm. Please park carefully. Charges are £3 for up to four hours (£5 for all day). There are toilets and a café in this car park. We recommend that you do not walk alone but in a small group. Use sunscreen, carry water and wear a hat if appropriate.
