

11TH SUNDAY OF THE YEAR. Theme: The Kingdom of God is like the Smallest of all Seeds.

The Word of the Lord is compared to a seed, which is sown in a field. The idea of the seed reminds us of how Jesus' invitation to enter his kingdom comes in the form of parables. The two Parables of the Growing Seed and the Mustard Seed invite us to always recognize the power of God working imperceptibly in our lives.

Although human beings have to work hard like a farmer by preparing the land, to sow the good seeds, to keep the field free of competing weeds and harmful insects, the sprouting and growth depend on God; how? he does not know. albeit gradual. Since God himself is concerned about us, we should expect that he would lead us in paths that promote genuine and abundant fruit. Our expectation should be based on our knowledge that growth is something God himself desires for us. Once the seed is sown, God cares for the growth. It is the invisible action of the Holy Spirit that causes the growth of the Kingdom of God. Like the farmer, we can nurture this growth by removing the thorns and thistles in our lives. We can make the decisions to avoid the things that hamper our personal growth – avoiding certain books and television programmes, certain sites on the internet, festering resentments, concern only for ourselves and our interests and indifference to the needy. We can nourish the seed of our faith by reading God's words, Personal prayer and the celebration of the Sacraments.

If we allow God to work in us, we will grow – even though we may not be aware of it at the time. The seeds in the Parables of today's gospel are meant to show that great things come from God and usually from small beginnings. Let us pray that in doing small things with great love we shall please God always.
