

**CORPUS CHRISTI. Theme:** Take it, this is my body; this is the blood of the covenant...

The Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ celebrates God's unfathomable covenant of love with humanity through his Son Jesus Christ. This new covenant is not based on the law; it is dependent on the blood that Christ shed on the cross. That is to say, it is dependent solely on love. He gave himself to us in the form of bread and wine. God demonstrated his love for humanity through his Beloved Son Jesus. He offered himself on the Cross, as a memorial of the Covenant of Love in his Body and Blood; He said, "this is my body, this is my blood of the covenant..."

The Solemnity of Corpus Christi is rightly described as God's Covenant of Love with humanity in his Son. In this covenant, Jesus Christ freely and gratuitously gives us his Body and Blood to heal and strengthen us. In the Eucharistic Covenant, Christians encounter Jesus Christ under the veil of Bread and Wine so that we may learn to offer our very self.

The Solemnity of Corpus Christi clearly explains the sacrifice of love of Christ on the cross. He did this in order to perpetuate the sacrifice of the cross throughout the ages until he should come again, and to entrust to his beloved spouse, the church, a memorial of his death and resurrection: a sacrament of love, a sign of unity, a bond of charity, a paschal banquet in which Christ is consumed, the mind is filled with grace, and a pledge of future glory is given us. (Ccc# 1323) The body and blood of Christ is given to persons with living faith and not persons with no faith.

May we always approach the Eucharistic Celebration and Meal with reverence and gratitude to God the Father, so that we may experience in ourselves the fruits of our redemption in his Son Jesus Christ.

**CAFOD - Share the Journey:** Pope Francis has launched Share the Journey, a new global campaign to stand up for the rights of people on the move. CAFOD asks us to join together in walking around the world. On 10 June we will walk in solidarity with our global neighbours fleeing their homes. We will be walking around the reservoir at Sywell Country Park – a distance of only 2.5 miles. The miles we walk will be added to the total from across England and Wales. Please join us for a Sunday afternoon walk. The circular walk is fairly easy but not suitable for wheelchairs. If you are bringing a child's buggy and find the terrain tricky you may prefer to walk a shorter distance and turn back at the point where the footpath ends. Register and begin the walk in the lower car park between 1.30pm and 2.30 pm. Please park carefully. Charges are £3 for up to four hours (£5 for all day). There are toilets and a café in this car park. We recommend that you do not walk alone but in a small group. Use sunscreen, carry water and wear a hat if appropriate.
