FOURTEENTH SUNDAY OF THE YEAR. Theme: My Power is at its best in weakness!

Jesus goes to his hometown of Nazareth, teaches on the Sabbath day, and his own people rejected him. Despite his wisdom and miraculous powers, his own people do not believe in him rather they took offence at him. Jesus "could not do any mighty work there and he marvels because of their unbelief" (Mark 6:6).

Faith involves a relationship with the Lord. Like every human relationship, the relationship between the men of God and God's people is also associated with disappointments, uncertainties and intolerance. The prophet Ezekiel was sent by God to the people of Israel, unfortunately, the people ignored the words of the prophet although they originated from God. Nonetheless, Ezekiel's presence speaks harsh realities that cannot be ignored.

The life of St. Paul was not different from the life of Prophet Ezekiel in terms of challenges. He pleaded with the Lord three times for the situation to change, but he heard a voice that said, "My grace is enough for you: my power is at its best in weakness". Their faith in God sustained them in this difficult relationship. Only Faith can embrace the mysterious ways of God's almighty power. This faith glories in its weakness in order to draw to itself Christ's power. The Virgin Mary is the supreme model of this faith, for she believed that 'nothing will be impossible with God' and was able to magnify the Lord: For he who is mighty has done great things for me, and holy is his name'.(CCC#273)

Similarly, when Jesus speaks to us in Scripture and we believe him, we too will know his power and he will work in our lives. Faith calls for obedience to God. As we obey him out of love, God can work in our lives. "If you love me you will obey my commandments" (Jn. 14:15). Obedience, trust and hope are essential parts of faith.

Constant faith in God through prayer is the basis for a fruitful life.
