

TWENTY SECOND SUNDAY OF THE YEAR. Theme: Worship of God and Human Tradition

The Pharisees who confronted Jesus about his disciples' ritual purity were so concerned with strict observance of the law that they lost sight of God's desire for mercy, justice and love. Such inverted priorities by the Pharisees caused Jesus to respond abruptly and forcefully as he directed his disciples to look at the state of their hearts before they considered their actions. When we look at Jesus' description of the human heart and the sins that arise from it (Mark 7:20-21), we might feel a sense of self-condemnation and despair. Who could look at such a list without seeing something of a reflection of his/her own inner state?

God calls us to examine our hearts not so that we would feel condemned, but so that we would know freedom and peace. Many saints have commented that the more deeply they saw their sins, the more fully they recognized God's mercy and love. The humility they demonstrated was no cowardice, but a recognition of their need for God, coupled with confidence in his power at work in them. In fact, they considered it a privilege to come to such self -knowledge, for it always led them to the Lord. It was this privilege that these Pharisee denied themselves and prevented their followers from experiencing. Let us ask the Spirit to search our hearts and minds and help us to see how we can respond more deeply by loving one another more genuinely.
