### **TWENTY-SIXTH SUNDAY OF THE YEAR. Theme: "Anyone who is not against us is for us"**

Today our World seems quite divided. There is little room for unity because of politics, migration, race, social status and gender issues. The sense of THEM and US seems also to be prevalent in the time of Jesus as we can read in the first reading and the gospel today. Who belongs to the inner circles? Jesus answers the crowd saying, "Anyone who is not against us is for us". (Mk 9:40).

The disciples feel quite proud of themselves and think that somehow their authority lies with the inner circle: "...And because he was not one of us we tried to stop him" (Mark 9:38). Jesus replies his disciples not to look down on others who are not members of the privileged group. According to Jesus, if he is performing miracles in his name then he is one of them. It is not their names collectively but Jesus' personal name that is crucial, and the focus of the mission is not the privileged status but how to powerfully invade Satan's territory.

Any gift extended in Jesus' name, whether a spectacular gift like casting out demons or a simple cup of water, is a gift offered to Christ himself. The man the disciples condemn has welcomed others as a servant and therefore has welcomed Jesus and the Father, whereas, by their denial of the man's Christ-centred hospitality, the disciples are in danger of preventing him from serving in Jesus' name.

The closer we come to Jesus, the humbler we become. The richer we become, the more we should be humble. The rich, therefore, must not condemn the innocent and kill them although they offered him no resistance.

We are reminded of ecumenical unity. To achieve this unity involves the whole church, the faithful and the clergy. We must realize that this holy objective- the reconciliation of all Christians in the unity of the one and only church of Christ- transcends human powers and gifts. That is why we place all our hope 'in the prayer of Christ for the church, in the love of the Father for us, and in the power of the Holy Spirit. (CCC#822)

**Prayer to St Michael the Archangel.** For those who are unsure of the words of the prayer which is recited at the end of every Mass, before the final blessing: **Holy Michael the Archangel, defend us in the day of battle; Be our safeguard against the wickedness and snares of the devil. May God rebuke him we humbly pray, and do thou, prince of the heavenly host, by the power of God, thrust down to hell Satan and all wicked spirits who wander through the world For the ruin of souls. Amen.**

"Rosamund, a lady in her late 50s, was suddenly abandoned by her husband of nearly 40 years, who left with another woman. She was devastated and found herself almost destitute, no longer able to afford the rent on their flat. She managed to find a cheaper flat in another area, away from her former husband, but had no resources to get started, and as he had taken much of their furniture and household equipment, she needed help in her new home. With the support of the SVP, who purchased a cooker and a fridge/freezer for her, and also found good quality furniture through local appeals, she is now beginning to rebuild her life."

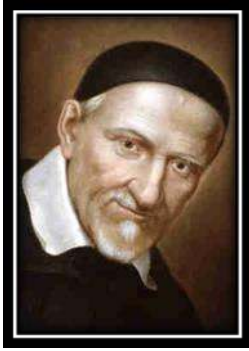

### CONFERENCE UPDATE

Between 1<sup>st</sup> April 2017 to 31<sup>st</sup> March 2018 we have managed to help 35 individuals and 2 families. We totalled over 307 visits and opened the Vinnies drop in centre 23 times last year.

2017 was the start of our School Out Reach Scheme where the SVP linked up with local schools who are able to refer beneficiaries to us for us to help where we can with food bank vouchers or guidance.

We've supported families from a local charity who helps individuals affected by domestic violence. When they come to the end of support with the charity we help them set up in our area through help with furniture, whilst they get back on their feet.

Vinnies continues to be a success and we spend time, have a chat, a cup of tea and cake, with local residents. We are starting to feel like part of the community and we are hoping to be able to encourage some more people to come and see us.

Over the last year, we have been overwhelmed by your generosity; the second collection and support we received at the afternoon tea was amazing. We are truly grateful for all your support, without you and your donations we could not do what we do.

We are a small group with some challenges ahead. We'd be grateful if you can spare some time and join us.
