

TWENTY-EIGHTH SUNDAY OF THE YEAR. Theme: "For human beings it is impossible, but not for God "

The rich young man that ran up to Jesus Christ is representing humanity or all of us running around...either for money, good health, recognition, power etc....Unfortunately these things without the spirit of wisdom do not bring us happiness or satisfaction...! St. Augustine will say our hearts will remain restless until they rest in God!

In the Gospel today, the rich young man desires the best of both worlds – the fullness of eternal life and worldly riches as well. However Jesus Christ makes two requirements of the rich young man. Firstly, he must give up his possessions. Those things that prevent one from following Jesus. By demanding that the young man sell his property and follow him, Jesus was calling on him to place his trust and dependence on God. Jesus warned his disciples about the dangers of riches. The disciples were shocked. According to Judaic thought, wealth was attributed to divine favour; why should they give them up? It is no wonder they thought that Jesus was demanding too much of a successful young man who had so eagerly and faithfully obeyed the commandments of God.

The second requirement Jesus makes of this man is the invitation that Jesus extends to all would be disciples: "follow me". Jesus desires a personal relationship with everyone. Jesus Christ wants to love you as a person. Jesus, looking at him, loved him. Jesus' call to discipleship is costly. He asks all of his followers to sacrifice everything for his sake, for the reward is great. We may wonder if this is possible! Jesus assures us, "With men it is impossible, but not with God; for all things are possible with God". (Mark 10:27).

Many of us also seek eternal life, but are ready or willing to sell our houses, cars, clothes, and valuables in order to give the money to the poor.

Are we ready to embrace the personal love of Jesus? Are we ready to depend solely on Christ for our personal fulfilment? This may be impossible by human standards, but Jesus tells us that it is possible with God. How? Start by doing what is necessary, then what is possible, and suddenly you are doing the impossible. Each day we must read and understand the Word of God. It is the Word of God that makes the impossible very possible.
