

TWENTY-NINTH SUNDAY OF THE YEAR. Theme: He came to give his life as a ransom for many.

Jesus Christ explains his redemptive mission to the disciples. When James and John approached Jesus Christ for places of honour in his kingdom, He took the opportunity to teach his disciples about how to become great in the Kingdom of God. They must become servants – just like him. He knew that in his Father's opinion, it was the servants who are given high positions, not the master.

Jesus offers James and John the privilege of sharing in his sufferings. Can you drink the cup that I must drink, or be baptized with the baptism with which I must be baptized? (Mk 10:38) Later on, they suffered death as they were witnessing to the saving works of Jesus (Acts 12:2). Throughout his life, Jesus was consumed by love that compelled him to live for others, never for himself. "For our sake, Christ was crucified under Pontius Pilate, He suffered death and was buried..." This is the faith that we profess. In Jesus's opinion, this is what it meant to be a king – to lay down his life for his friends.

In all of his life, Jesus presents himself as our model. In humbling himself, he has given us an example to imitate, through his prayer he draws us to pray, and by his poverty, he calls us to accept freely the privation and persecutions that may come our way. (CCC#520)

Let us pray that we may return love for hatred. We may also sacrifice our time and energy to perform hidden acts of love. Consequently, let each of us called to be Christians drink from Jesus' cup of suffering by our willingness to serve, to reflect the life and our love of Jesus, the humblest servant.
