

THIRTIETH SUNDAY OF THE YEAR. Theme: "Go your way, your faith has saved you."

In Mark's gospel, the healing of Bartimaeus is the last reported miracle of Jesus prior to his entry into Jerusalem. In Jerusalem, he would suffer, die and rise to new life. In today's gospel we heard of a blind beggar sitting on the periphery of society. Bartimaeus perceived Jesus of Nazareth as the Messiah and the Son of David who would restore all things. He was, therefore, never perturbed by the people scolding him and shouting at him to keep quiet. He knew what he wanted from Jesus and believed in him absolutely: "he only shouted all the louder, 'Son of David, have pity on me'". His persistence and faith won him an audience with the Messiah. Amazingly, the people who scolded and shouted at him became friendly: "Courage, get up, he is calling you". Those who sought to quiet him now encourage him. Bartimaeus was full of faith and hope that even before meeting Jesus. He threw off his cloak, jumped up and went to Jesus to put his request before him: "Master, let me see again". Jesus honoured his request whereas the request of James and John was not honoured.

The difference in result was not only due to faith. Unlike the two disciples who believed Jesus has power to grant them such privilege, the faith of Bartimaeus was born of a servant attitude. Jesus acknowledged this faith in Bartimaeus. When faith is absent, Jesus is unable to heal anyone.

Bartimaeus, immediately upon receiving his sight, followed Jesus along the way to Jerusalem. He became the last disciple of Jesus Christ before his entry into Jerusalem.

May the Lord do great things in our lives and our families so that we may know the joy of gospel.
