THIRTY-THIRD SUNDAY OF THE YEAR. Theme: "...but my words will not pass away".

Jesus said that he would surely come, but on that day no one knows except the Father in heaven who knows the day and hour. In the meantime, Jesus knew his followers would have to endure trying moments, a moment of great distress, unparalleled since nations first came into existence. Hope Centre. On 15 October the Hope Centre were given just 12 months' notice to vacate the day centre facility in Oasis House. The Day Centre is a place where the homeless and vulnerable of Northampton have come to know and trust. Individuals who use the service receive a fantastic service, and being asked to leave is already having a negative impact on many of those people we seek to support. The premises is to be converted into a relocated council night shelter: the decision was made without wider consultation. The Hope Centre are hoping they can get Northampton Borough Council to change their decision, made in conjunction with Midland Heart, asking them to find an alternative venue for the night shelter, rather than unnecessarily renovating a building which is already in use and supporting the homeless and others in need very effectively.
