THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT. Theme: A Joyful voice cries in the Wilderness.

The season of Advent presents us the personality of John the Baptist. The Gospel of John perceives this man as the forerunner of Jesus Christ. John the Baptist joyfully comes to proclaim the fulfilment of God's plan and prepare us for the coming of Christ.

He does not draw attention to himself in any way and does not project himself to be the Priests and the Levites. He makes three specific denials. He says he is not the Messiah; neither is he Elijah nor the Prophet. He denied being the Messiah because the Messiah was among them but they did not know. He denied being Elijah because he has not come to arrange all disputes. Secondly, he has come to anoint the Messiah to his kingly office. He was not the Prophet. This is because he does not see himself as the greatest of all the prophets, Prophet par excellence.

If John the Baptist is none of those popular figures then who is he? What is he doing? The first question is answered from Isaiah 40:3; He is nothing but a VOICE inviting men to prepare the way for the King. John the Baptist clearly sees Jesus as his superior, "... I am not fit to kneel down and undo the strap of his sandals ..." His final act of utter humility is when he proclaims; "He must increase, I must decrease" (John 3:30).

Christians are supposed to be persons to be associated with joy. Unfortunately, people outside the church do not associate Christians with joy. They are more likely to associate Christians with long faces, with carrying the cross and with suffering. Also, our secular world associate happiness with pleasure and accumulation of material things, rather our genuine happiness flows from the knowledge that life has both meaning and purpose. Like John the Baptist, we should know who we are? And what we are in this world to do? We can be assured of happiness at all times when we remind ourselves that For God loves us so much that he sent his only Son to us on a Christmas day. St. Augustine understood this when he wrote; "we are made for you, Lord, and our hearts will not rest until they rest in you." There is a joyful voice in us that will spring up in the sight of all nations.

Our prayer today is, my soul glories the Lord, my spirit rejoices in my God, my saviour.
