**EASTER SUNDAY. Theme:** He saw and he believed.

The sight suddenly penetrated to John's mind; he realized what he had happened- and he believed. It was not what he had read in scripture, which convinced him that Jesus had risen; it was what he saw with his own eyes. Christians today celebrate the victory of the empty tomb. It is a celebration based on the conviction that our relationship with Jesus, broken by his death on the Cross, is renewed by his resurrection. Nevertheless, the empty tomb alone is not the basis for the resurrection. The basis for the resurrection is our faith in the Risen Lord, who foretold that he would suffer, die and rise again on the third day. He fulfilled this promise by rising from the dead. They saw and believe. Christians are people of the resurrection and alleluia should always be the song on our lips. We must look beyond the positioning of the linen cloth, "see and believe", like the beloved disciple, and believe in the Risen Lord. He rose from the dead in fulfilment of Scriptures, which insist, "that he must rise from the dead". As we celebrate the resurrection of the Son of God, the cornerstone of our faith, we come to the realization that the resurrection is not simply an event after death but should be a reality of our everyday life. We must let go and die to our old and sinful ways and allow the new life in the image of the Risen Lord to germinate, sprout, mature and bear fruit for eternity. May Christ, our Passover fills us with Joy.
