

TWENTY FIRST SUNDAY OF THE YEAR. Theme: "It is the Spirit that gives Life".

Jesus continuous to teach about the gift of his body and blood. Although Jesus has been with the disciples closely, they found his teaching quite complex to understand and even more difficult to accept. We realized that there were some of those who listened to Jesus but turned away at this point and followed him no longer (John 6:66). However, those whose minds were open to God were able to receive the promise of eternal life, even though their understanding remained incomplete. This contrast between those who left and those who remained illustrates an important spiritual truth: A mind dominated by the flesh insists upon understanding before believing. However, the spiritual mind will seek to believe before wanting to understand fully. The church teaches that "Faith and reason are like two wings on which the human spirit rises to the contemplation of truth; and God has placed in the human heart a desire to know the truth—in a word, to know himself—so that, by knowing and loving God, men and women may also come to the fullness of truth about themselves" (#Fides et Ratio).

If we try to grasp the truths about God's kingdom with our human mind alone, we will conclude that the gospel is foolishness (1 Cor. 1:18). In order to understand what pleases God, we must call upon the Holy Spirit for enlightenment through prayer, scripture and in celebrating the Sacraments. Christ reminds us: "It is the Spirit that gives life, the flesh is of no avail" (John 6:63). It is only through the Holy Spirit that truths can come to life for us and bring us into a new relationship with God.

Come, Holy Spirit fill the hearts of your faithful and enkindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth your spirit and they shall be created. And you will renew the face of the earth. O God, who by the light of the Holy Spirit, Did instruct the hearts of the faithful. Grant that by the same spirit, we may be truly wise and ever enjoy His Consolations.

Many Congratulations to the Students and Staff of Thomas Becket Catholic School. Students and staff at Thomas Becket Catholic School are quite rightly celebrating after securing wonderful examination results at both 'A' Level and GCSE. More than 20 per cent of **all 'A' Level results** attained at Thomas Becket Catholic School were A*-A grades, with two thirds of all results secured achieving at least a C or equivalent. Mr Ciran Stapleton, Headteacher, said: "We are so proud of what our students have achieved. They have worked hard to get the top grades they needed in some really difficult qualifications...What is really pleasing is that so many students haven't just secured the grades they were aiming for, they have surpassed and exceeded their targets. They really have shown what can be achieved with dedication and belief."

The GCSE results were similarly pleasing; "In maths, for example, our students were, on average, half a grade up on what was predicted and of national expectation. There is a similar story in English and a host of other subjects. This is testament to the talent and commitment of everyone in our community". Mr Stapleton added: "I really do think that these results are a huge milestone for the school. In fact, they are game changing. When I joined this school just over 12 months ago what was needed more than anything was belief. Moving our Progress 8 score from a negative figure to what, I believe, will be a positive figure shows what has been achieved. "It has now set the standard for our next cohort of Year 11s and it means that we are able to welcome a record number of students into our Sixth Form. It will act as the platform for our staff to continue to embrace new ideas and challenge themselves and our students. "I am very proud of our community. The future is very bright indeed."
