

THIRTY-SECOND SUNDAY OF THE YEAR. Theme: "...From the little she had has put in everything..."

Among the many virtues that please Jesus Christ is humility. "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven." (Matt 5:3) This is one of the Gospel passages that invite us to examine the depths of our hearts, to see where we find our security in life.

The story of the widow's mite demonstrates powerfully the virtue of humility and lowliness. Like Mary, the Blessed Virgin Mary, God looked upon the lowliness of the widow as she put in two small coins as her offering. This is a free and gratuitous love that validates, transforms and changes the deepest level of her faith. This is what we all desire and what we were created for. Today, many people perceive humility as a sign weakness or allowing others to take advantage of you, but a true humility means radical dependence on God.

The widow's humility is even more remarkable when she is compared with those who put "large sums" in the temple treasury. Many of these donors were probably giving the amount dictated by the law, yet it was still money they could spare. Despite their lukewarm contribution, they could go away satisfied with their contribution but failing to grasp how God wanted them to depend on him for everything. Meanwhile, the widow had the faith to believe that even if she gave God everything she had to live on, he would never let him down. He was worth everything she had, and she willingly placed herself in his hands.

According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church, the example of the poor widow demonstrates the importance of detachment from riches as a condition for entrance into the Kingdom of heaven. (CCC#2547) On Remembrance Day, Jesus reminds us to celebrate the many widows of the military men and the joy of the poor to whom the Kingdom already belongs. Let us ask God to make us more like this poor widow, humble and dependent on him, knowing that he alone can satisfy and fill our every need.

Hope Centre. On 15 October the Hope Centre were given just 12 months' notice to vacate the day centre facility in Oasis House. The Day Centre is a place where the homeless and vulnerable of Northampton have come to know and trust. Individuals who use the service receive a fantastic service, and being asked to leave is already having a negative impact on many of those people we seek to support. The premises is to be converted into a relocated council night shelter: the decision was made without wider consultation. The Hope Centre are hoping they can get Northampton Borough Council to change their decision, made in conjunction with Midland Heart, asking them to find an alternative venue for the night shelter, rather than unnecessarily renovating a building which is already in use and supporting the homeless and others in need very effectively.
