**Ss PETER & PAUL: Theme:** "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God"

At every Eucharistic celebration, we profess that; "I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic church." The focus of today's celebration is on the Apostles Saint Peter and Paul, the Apostles of Christ. Christ governs the church through Peter, Paul and other apostles who are present in their successors, the Pope and the college of bishops.

What does it mean when we pray that, the church is Apostolic? The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches that in three ways:

Firstly, because she was and remains built on the foundation of the Apostles. The apostles are the first witnesses of the Gospel and also to be sent out by Christ himself.

Secondly, because we received from the apostles the teaching of Christ as the "good deposit" of faith, she keeps and hands on this teaching with the help of the Spirit dwelling in her.

Thirdly, the church is apostolic because she continues to be taught, sanctified and guided by the apostles in the pastoral office of the bishop, assisted by the priest in union with the successor of Peter until the return of the Christ. (CCC#857)

We have a mission like St. Paul by virtue of our baptisms. In the spirit of humility, we must acknowledge the proximity of our own death. We must look forward to eternal life after every human achievement. Like St. Paul, we must see our approaching death as a Sacrifice...it is the moment that our life is "being poured out like a libation."

We are also like the Apostle Peter, asked to confess that Christ is the Son of the living God, the cornerstone and Head of the Church. This is an indispensable truth of the faith revealed to him by the Father through the Holy Spirit. (CCC# 153) In effect, to believe in Christ means to desire unity; to desire unity means to desire the Church; to desire, the Church means to desire the communion of grace that corresponds to the Father's plan from all eternity". Today we celebrate how St. Peter and St. Paul each in their different way gathered together the one Family of Christ.
