## TWENTY-NINTH SUNDAY OF THE YEAR: Theme: "...the need to Pray continually and never lose heart."

Jesus, in the Gospel, demonstrates the true meaning of prayer. It is about the strength never to lose heart. The Israelites in today's first reading with Moses prayed and they were successful; when he stopped, they began to fail. In the gospel reading, Jesus presents a similar view of prayer. Whiles the widow persisted, the judge gave her what she wanted. The importance of Prayer cannot be overemphasized. The Catechism has dedicated almost 100 pages on Prayer as a topic (CCC#2558- #2865).

We may never know why God seems to answer some prayers and not answer other prayers. Prayer always takes place within the context of an active relationship with the living God. The greatest desire of every prayer is "Thy will be done". That is the basis of all prayers. If we pray and truly believe that God's will bring us happiness, then we will never lose heart in our prayer. Prayer builds our relationship with God, whatever the apparent outcome of our prayer.

For Instance, in the Garden of Gethsemane, Jesus' prayer did not save him from the cross but led him to the resurrection. If we can pray with Jesus' faith, we will never lose heart; for if God's will be done, then our victory is assured and our prayers are answered. May the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ enlighten our minds to speak to God when we pray, and to listen to him when we read the scriptures. (CCC#2654)
